**Orienteering** To enhance school's OAA (Outdoor Adventurous Activity) – a key part of the PE curriculum, we had orienteering courses installed on the school grounds this week. Orienteering, a walking or running sport, involves map reading and looking for clues at control points. For those children and parents walking past school on Wednesday night wondering why all teachers were out running about the yard and field, we were getting training from the man who installed the courses. Over the next few weeks, the children will get to explore the courses on offer.

**Snacks** A polite reminder that snacks brought in by Y1-Y6 children should be as healthy as possible. As well as fruit, children could bring in a small piece of cheese or a cereal type bar but if this is the case, please check that it does not contain any nuts. Chocolate bars, crisps and sweets are not a suitable snack. Similarly, drinks in bottles should be water or juice and not energy drinks or milkshakes.

Reception children will continue to have a snack provided for them in-line with EYFS guidance on healthy eating and the prevention of choking.

**PE Uniform** As well as having suitable PE clothing and footwear, children should not wear earrings unless they can take them out themselves. If they cannot, an adult should remove them before school. If children do wear earrings, they should be a small stud.
